- We ended the year in the black.
- We delivered on all the programs and services we promised.
- We added three new board members and strengthened community representation on the Programs and Services Committee
- We hired a new staff team that is exceptional in dedication to the Center's mission and in productivity.
- We are stronger, leaner than ever before!

Credit for this progress under constraints belongs to many – the Board and Executive Committee that stepped in and kept things running during staff transition; Mary McMurtrey whose energy is formidable and spirit is unquenchable; the new staff members who have demonstrated creativity and commitment in doing more with less; and our Members whose continued support in hard times sustained all of the above throughout the year. - Certainty that we can build on the programmatic and financial success of 2009.
- Certainty that the economy's improvement will create new opportunities for advancing philanthropy in St. Louis.
- Certainty that the Center is well-positioned to both participate and lead in that advancement.

The needs of our community have never been greater. Neither have the opportunities for creative philanthropy to meet those needs. The Center is poised and ready to help members and the community rise to the challenge!

The St. Louis Mental Health Board worked closely with nonprofits serving the needs of new Americans in St. Louis. Through this collaboration the CANA network was created for immigrants needing critical and timely mental health services.

Monsanto has been providing grants as well as employee judges and volunteers for the Academy of Science's Greater St. Louis Science Fair for over 60 years--with a far reaching impact on 50,000 students in grades K - 12 per year.


- CONNECT Will to Give was launched in 2006 to provide support to nonprofits and professional advisors in connecting with individual donors about the importance of charitable bequest giving.
