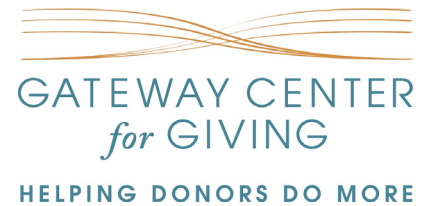


# Donor-to-Donor

## *Programs and Services for Members and Non-Member Grantmakers*



### HAVE A SPECIAL PROJECT YOU WOULD LIKE THE CENTER TO SUPPORT? DO YOU HAVE A TOPIC FOR A GRANTMAKER PROGRAM?

The Donor-to-Donor Program Model (D2D) allows the Center to put your good ideas to work. This fee-for-service programming allows grantmakers to “buy” Center staff time for programs that are consistent with the mission, vision and values of the Center while meeting the needs of the grantmaking community.

This service is open to all member and non-member grantmakers!

#### Commonly Asked Questions

*Do my member dues include D2D Programs?*

Member dues do not cover the cost to underwrite the programs but do cover attendance.

*Who can sponsor a D2D Program?*

Member or non-member grantmakers can underwrite a D2D program. This is a great way for grantmakers who are not members to advance philanthropy in our region.

*What is included in the D2D service fee?*

Center staff time and program development from inception to implementation to evaluation (including identifying speaker, drafting discussion points/agendas, researching resource materials, etc). Program costs will be worked out with the Grantmaker underwriting the program.

*Can I approach the Center with any sort of Program?*

No. The potential program must fall within the Center’s Collaboration Guidelines and meet the approval of the Programs and Services Committee. The programs should be targeted at Grantmakers. If a grantmaker wishes to support a program for nonprofits this can be discussed as long as it fits within the lens of what grantmakers want nonprofits to know. The Center does not support technical training for nonprofits.

## Success of Our Past Donor-to-Donor Programs

- ◆ The Incarnate Word Foundation of St. Louis in 2010 funded the “On the Ground” program series to help inform grantmakers about the different possibilities and opportunities in exploring place-based grantmaking.
- ◆ Daughters of Charity Foundation of St. Louis along with Ameren Missouri and the Greater St. Louis Community Foundation in 2010 and 2011 provided funding to support the creation and roll out of the Missouri Common Grant Application. A group of dedicated grantmakers came together over the course of a year to support the development of this application which has now been adopted by more than 15 area foundations.
- ◆ Missouri Foundation for Health and the Incarnate Word Foundation funded the development and presentation of two reports: Understanding the Intermediary Infrastructure in St. Louis and Measuring the Work of Intermediaries in the St. Louis Region. This work has advanced the important conversation about intermediaries in our region and helped shed light on a model that is not well-known.
